## RESPONSE HIGHLIGHTS



### SHELTER AND INFRASTRUCTURE

- 284,515 Corrugated galvanised iron sheets
- 31,465 Tarpaulins
- 13,600 Blankets and sleeping mats
- 4,810 Winter kits for family



### EDUCATION AND CHILD PROTECTION

- 10 Damaged schools repair and rehabilitation
- 64 TLCs with WASH facilities
- 10,549 Students kits
- 4,927 Children provided with psychosocial support



### HEALTH

- 1,603 Women, Adolescent, Youth and Children Spaces sessions
- 3 Health institutions repair
- 3,623 Baby hygiene kits



### WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH)

- 118 Water systems construction
- 9,684 Toilets repair/ construction
- 17,604 Households reached through WASH awareness activities



### LIVELIHOODS

- 15961 Households participated in cash for work
- 8957 Households received vulnerable family assistance
- 6523 Households received agriculture inputs


## 10 RESPONSE DISTRICTS\*
