# outcome level changes

## health



**77.8%** of communities in Western Equatoria use treated nets

**85%** completion of measles vaccination

## water and sanitation hygiene (Upper Nile)



**87%** report water is accessible below an hour

**85%** of female-headed households have year round access to portable

**93%** reported that water sources as safe to access

**38.6%** of population use improved sanitation facilities all the time

**89%** practice general handwashing. 45% of men, women, boys and girls with appropriate handwashing behavior

## nutrition (Juba & Upper Nile)



**93%** OTP cure rate of children under five

**86%** targeted supplementary feeding program cure rates children under five

**90%** rates for pregnant and lactating women at TSFP

**88%** mothers in Yambio practice exclusive breastfeeding

Reduction in GAM from **21.7%** (18.1 - 25.7 95% C.I.) to **6.8%** MUAC proxy GAM

Reduction in SAM from **4.9%** (3.3- 7.2 95% C.I.) to **1.7%** SAM

## food security and livelihoods (Upper Nile)



**84%** households have sufficient diet, an increase from a baseline of 23%

**68%** households eat 2 or more meals, an increase from a baseline of 55%

**84%** households have sufficient diet diversity, an increase from baseline of 23%

**73%** farmers received extension services support, an increase from baseline of 36%

Reduction in average hunger months from 5 to 3

## protection (Upper Nile)



**94.4%** of people would report if something bad happened to them or to someone they know, such as abuse (physically or sexually)

**81.5%** of people know service points which accept reports of suspected child protection issues

**98.4%** of people would feel safe reporting if suspected that a child or adult in the community was being sexually exploited or abused
