

SITUATION REPORT SEPTEMBER 1 - SEPTEMBER 30, 2019

Key messages

- The number of refugees living in Rwanda is still estimated at 149,000, about half of whom are from the DRC and the other half are from Burundi. In addition, Rwanda will soon host 500 refugees and asylum-seekers currently in detention centers in Libya, as a result of a transit mechanism agreed upon by the Government of Rwanda, UNHCR, and the African Union. Given that refugees are gradually being integrated in national social and economic systems, while still receiving cash-based and in-kind assistance, refugees in Rwanda are expected to continue facing No Acute Food Insecurity (IPC Phase I!) through at least February 2020. (FEWS NET - Rwanda Key Message Update, September 2019)
- World Vision Rwanda was among the partners who received two groups of evacuees from Libya at Gashora reception Centre, the first group of 66 people arrived on September 26, 2019.

WATER, SANITATION & HYGIENE


- Clean potable water was supplied to 91,722 Refugee and Host community members in Mugombwa and Kigeme refugee camps.
- Sanitation facilities were maintained in Mugombwa and Kigeme Refugee Camps.

EDUCATION


• World Vision Rwanda supported 27,596 refugee children to access education through ECD, Primary and Secondary schools. The support included teacher's incentives, school feeding and school fees for students in boarding schools for children in Mugombwa, Kigeme, Kiziba, Gicumbi and Nyabiheke Refugee Camps.
