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





Girl, 15, Afghanistan "Some evenings we go to sleep without eating food, because there is nothing to eat." SCARED OF FALLING IN POVERTY






Boy, 15, Albania "I noticed that I have a major gap in learning and I need to work harder next year to achieve results."



Boy, 14, Lebanon "COVID-19 is ruining my life and the lives of children I know around me."




Pandemic impact on children's daily life










Paving the way to a new coalition of stakeholders willing to address Violent Child Discipline in Lebanon

Findings on child labour generated learning was used for evidence driven advocacy with UNICEF as a result of which psycho social support elements were added to respective grant to support targeted vulnerable refuge children in Lebanon

Finding were used to inform policy brief Breaking Point COVID-19 and the Child Protection Crisis in Afghanistan and the Donor Pledging Conference
