





# **Mirpur Urban Community Empowerment Project** on Waste and Sanitation Management

# **About the project**

MUCEP is a 3-year project working to establish, empower, and strengthen community-based waste management led by a WASH committee and a Waste Management Committee. The objective of the project is to transform and improve the living conditions of the community and their hygiene practices including Menstrual Hygiene Management. The fund is provided by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Japan. Budget for Bangladesh is approximately USD 1.8 million including grant from MOFA Japan and individual donors.

#### Goal

At the urban poor residential area, residents, especially women and children, will be able to live a hygienic and healthy life.

#### Outcome-1:

Strengthened community-based waste disposal systems in selected slums in Ward 2 under Dhaka North City Corporation(DNCC)

Output: 1 Community-led WASH and Waste Management Committees are functional

Output: 2 Waste collection and disposal systems are available in the target communities

#### Outcome-2:

Improved hygiene and sanitation (including MHM) practice of vulnerable women and children

Output: 1 Increased knowledge on hygiene practices among women and children in the target communities

Output: 2 Improved sanitation facilities available for women and children in the target communities

**Output: 3** Developed understanding of menstrual hygiene practices among the target communities, and increased access to gender-friendly WASH facilities for women and girls of menstruating age

Output: 4 School students are sensitised on proper WASH practices in schools and at the household level
