The Community's Life Back in 2009



The enrolment of children in primary school was only **60%** and **35%** of them drop out



79% of households used unclean drinking water



Only **3%** of households used toilet



Less than **1 in 3 mothers** of children under 2 years received at least 2 post-natal visits from a trained health care worker during the first week after birth



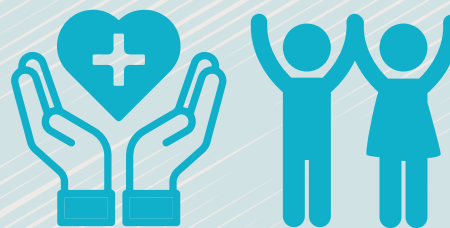
1 in 10 households have a designated place for handwashing where water and soap are present



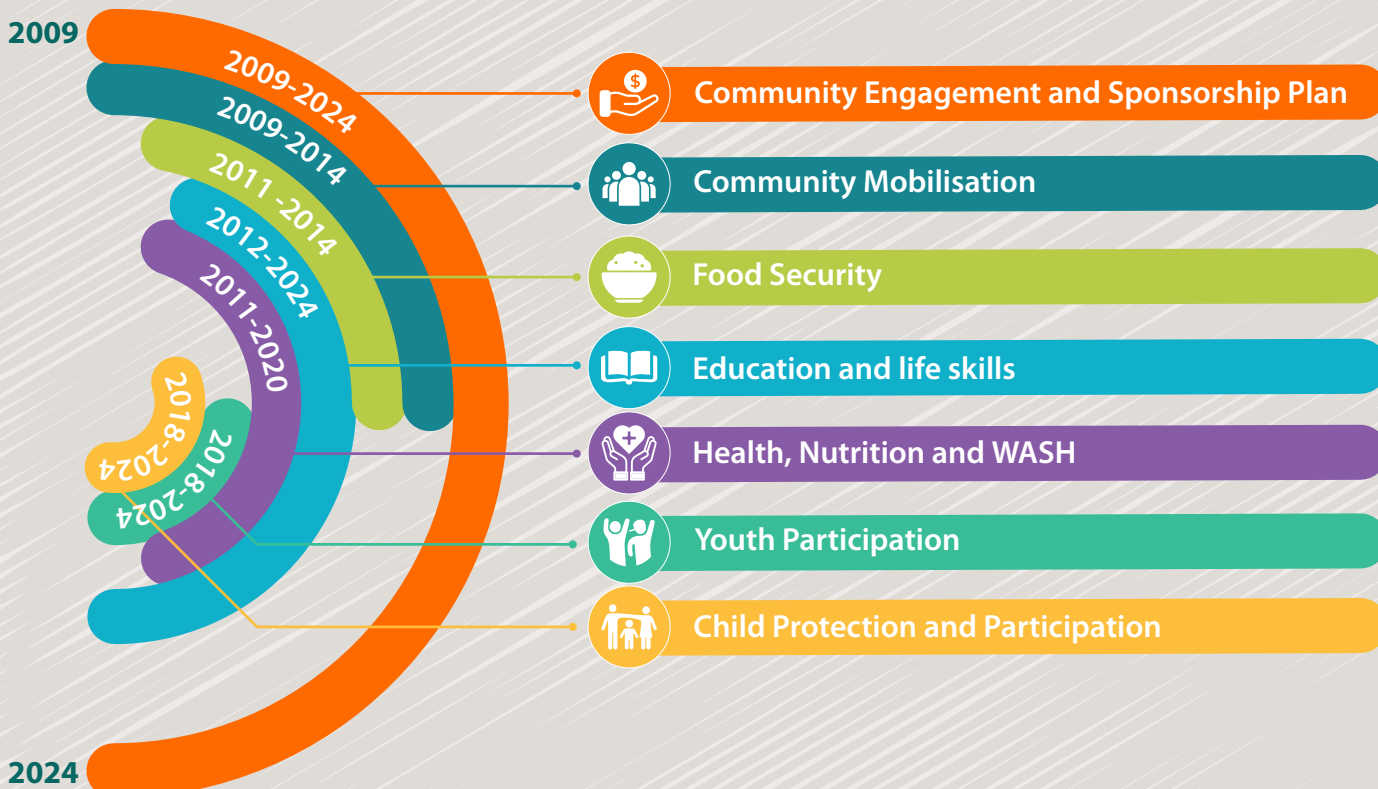
Less than **1 in 2 adolescents** are aware of the presence of services and mechanisms to reports abuse, neglect, exploitation or violence against children

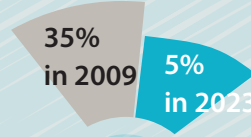

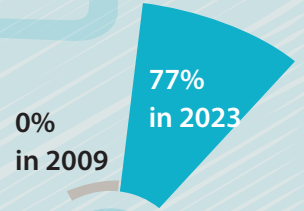

Grade 3 students reading with comprehension



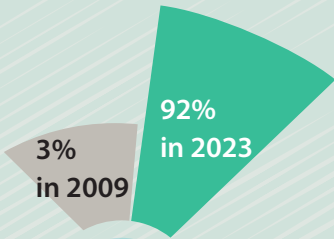
School Dropout rate



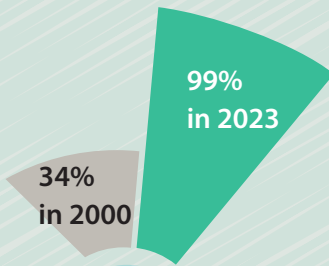

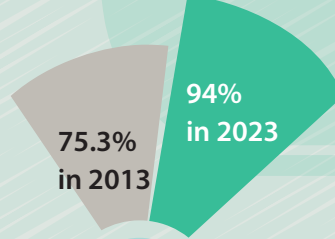

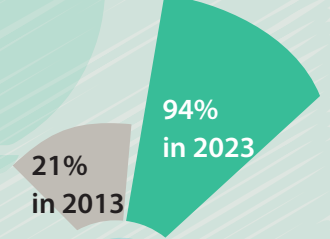

"We will continue to reach out to villagers in each village once a month to raise awareness about children's rights, domestic violence, child health and sanitation, infant care, and proper infant feeding. We continue to implement the knowledge we gained from World Vision," says Yim Sarun, Ta O Commune Committee For Women and Children (CCWC).



"Once our community members learned about growing vegetables, they were able to cultivate crops two to three times a year.
