

Ukraine Crisis Response | September 2024 Fact Sheet

In Ukraine, a 10-year conflict that started in the east of the country in 2014 reached to dramatic escalation of the war since the Russian Federation's 24 February 2022 invasion. It has caused the world's fastest growing displacement crisis since World War II, leaving at least:

- 33.3 million Population living in Ukraine 77% of total Ukrainian population before the conflict (43.5 million).
- 14.6 million People in need of humanitarian assistance in Ukraine - 44% of Population living in Ukraine.
- 6.8 million Refugees from Ukraine recorded across globally -16% of total Ukrainian population before the conflict (43.5 million).
- 3.7 million Internally displaced people 11% of Population living in Ukraine.
- 4.4 million Returnees 10% of total Ukrainian population before the conflict.

World Vision started working in Ukraine in March 2022 through 4 offices in Chernivtsi, Kyiv, Dnipro, and Lviv, which currently support aid efforts reaching conflict-affected people in 24 oblasts across Ukraine.

Ukraine Crisis Response Goal

The Ukrainian children, refugees and IDPs, as well as the host communities in Ukraine, Moldova, Romania, and Georgia have the support to overcome the humanitarian consequences of the

World Vision Presence

WV UCR Phase 1 Strategy 2022-2024 delivered an inclusive, need driven humanitarian assistance to refugees, IDPs, and the most vulnerable children and their families in Ukraine, Romania, Moldova, and Georgia.

WV UCR Phase 2 Strategy 2024-2026 continues the main Phase 1 directions by integrating humanitarian responses with early recovery and economic development interventions in joint programming with VisionFund, WV's microfinance subsidiary. WV UCR will continue operating in four countries: 70% in Ukraine, 20% in Moldova, 10% in Georgia and Romania.
