What is Go Baby Go (GBG)?

World Vision Pour les enfants

- Programming for holistic early childhood development (ECD) within an integrated (health, nutrition, WASH, protection, education, life skills, psychosocial support) Go Baby Go (GBG) framework
- Focused on 0 to <3 age range (beginning in pregnancy)
 due to the importance of this time period for lifelong
 health and well-being
- Foster parents/caregivers confidence and competence through sensitive and responsive caregiving practices to ensure that children grow physically, mentally, and socioemotionally to reach their full potential in life

IMPLEMENTATION



- First to be implemented in Haiti
- Life time of the project is for two years
- It is aligned/integrated with the Child Survival Program
- It will be implemented after contextualization in 3 APs in Central Plateau
- 25 ACPs (Agent Communautaire Polyvalent): each assigned between 150 to 200 families

Go Baby Go! & CVVBOs



GBG contributes to:

- i) Mothers and children are well nourished;
- ii) Mothers and children are protected from infection and disease;
- iii) Children are cared for in a safe family and community environment;
- iv) Parents/caregivers provide well for their children;
- v) Children experience the love of God and neighbor;
- vi) Children are respected participants from birth as "collaborators" in their early development;
- vii) Children are celebrated and registered at birth.

Go Baby Go! ECD Parenting Plus (GBG EPP) Curriculum



Aim: Improve ECD outcomes by strengthening parenting skills, practices and caregiver-baby and family relationships



GBG EPP: Learning in Action



To be linked with ongoing health, nutrition, WASH, child protection, agriculture, and/or education interventions & implementation!

Aim: To support young children's caregivers in the application of knowledge, skills and behavior by:

Providing additional information and technical support on ECD, effective ECD-promoting practices, and related issues

Facilitating peer support for caregivers through group-based learning

Providing linkages/referral to services as needed (i.e. economic development programs, health and nutrition, behavioral developmental services), particularly to high-risk families

In coordination with HN&WASH & CP, monitoring the application of practices and support the GBG vision


Baseline assessment



- CREDI (Caregiver Reported Early Development Index) tools from Harvard's University
