ZERO NEW INFECTIONS, ZERO AIDS-RELATED DEATHS AND ZERO STIGMA, ENSURING ALL CHILDREN ENJOY WELL-BEING

New HIV infections amongst children are eliminated and their mother's health and well-being sustained

Children affected by HIV survive and thrive Adolescents, especially girls, key populations and the most vulnerable, access combination prevention and treatment services and are empowered to protect themselves from HIV All children and families experience life free of stigma, discrimination and harmful social norms

Ecological model

Individuals and families have full information, skills and knowledge

Strong community systems provide care and support and link individuals and families to services

Health systems provide quality services, strong workforce, information, products and financing

Enabling environment provides supportive policies, social support, values and norms

Results of World Vision interventions

Family-centered counselling and referral ensures all pregnant women are referred for diagnosis and treatment: home visitor (ttC)

Community systems strengthened – CHWs trained and community organisations mobilised to provide care and linkages to health system

Health system strengthened: integrated facilities provide quality services for HIV diagnosis, counselling and treatment for mothers and infants

Social Accountability – women and communities know their rights and advocate for access to services (CVA) Family-centered counselling and referral ensures PSS support, referrals and monitoring

Communities mobilised, strengthened and resourced to target and care or OVC

Empowerment, socioeconomic support and access to health care and legal protections for OVC

State-provided social protection for the most vulneable

Parent-child communications strengthened for enhanced knowledge and healthy behaviours

School-based, adult-led life skills and sexual and reproductive health education

Access to appropriate quality HIV counselling, diagnosis, prevention and treatment services for adolescents and key populations

Empowerment and socioeconomic support

Engage faith communities to transform attitudes and values and mobilise care and support

Transformed gender norms promoting gender equity

Reformed policies, laws and regulations provide nondiscrimination, equity and access for marginalised groups

Application and implementation is appropriate to the epidemic and demographic context and funding availability.
