



KURDISH REGION OF IRAQ

World Vision has established its operations in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq (KRI) on September 2014. KRI is an autonomous region in Northern Iraq with borders at the Kurdish regions of Iran to the East, Turkey to the North, and Syria to the West, along with the rest of Iraq to the South.

It has a population of nearly four million. World Vision's operations are focused on its three governorates: Erbil, Duhok and Sulaymaniyah with a geographical area of about 40,000 square kilometres.

After assessments were completed, World Vision has secured registration to work in the three governorates with approximately 2.1 million internally-displaced persons (IDPs). The major concentration of the response work is on 220,000 displaced living in non-camps, particularly those who have settled in unused buildings and non-camp structures and receive less support from other organisations.



World Vision has conducted WASH Projects across Northern Iraq including, Dohuk, Erbil, Sulaymaniyah, and Ninewah and has been funded by both key bilateral donors and the UN alike.

WATER, SANITATION & HYGIENE

World Vision has worked closely with the government and WASH cluster to rehabilitate water treatment plants, improve water supply, and establish new water sources through boreholes serving both camp populations and host communities.

World Vision has an innovative strategy for developing partnership with local water authorities which was endorsed and adopted by the WASH cluster in Iraq as a model. World Vision also has a unique partnership with Handicap International and conducts disability inclusive WASH projects at the household and camp level.

World Vision is implementing its regional scale up with its reputable child focused partner: Sesame Street in implementing teacher training programming on culturally tailored behaviour change messages on hygiene promotion and water conservation. World Vision has also been a key actor in responding to new displacement from Mosul, constructing the WASH infrastructure in internally displaced persons (IDP) camps .

Goal 4

At least 15 projects are initiates in which communities and local government are empowered to facilitate sustainable WASH interventions and services.

Goal 3

Improved knowledge in hygiene promotion and behaviour change practices for poor vulnerable communities and children by benefitting over 317,121 people including children and women.



Goal I

Increased access to sustainable and safe water supply for over 1,682,149 people in five years including vulnerable children and women.

Goal 2

Increased access to 201,795 families to improved Sanitation for poor, vulnerable communities and children.
